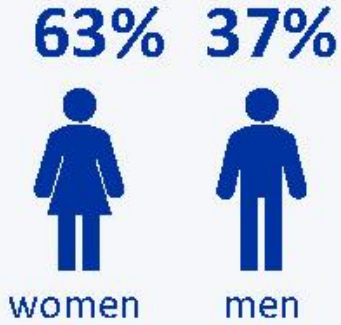

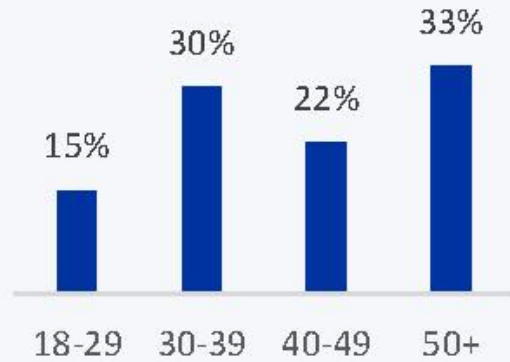

The share of men within the IDP population continues to shrink



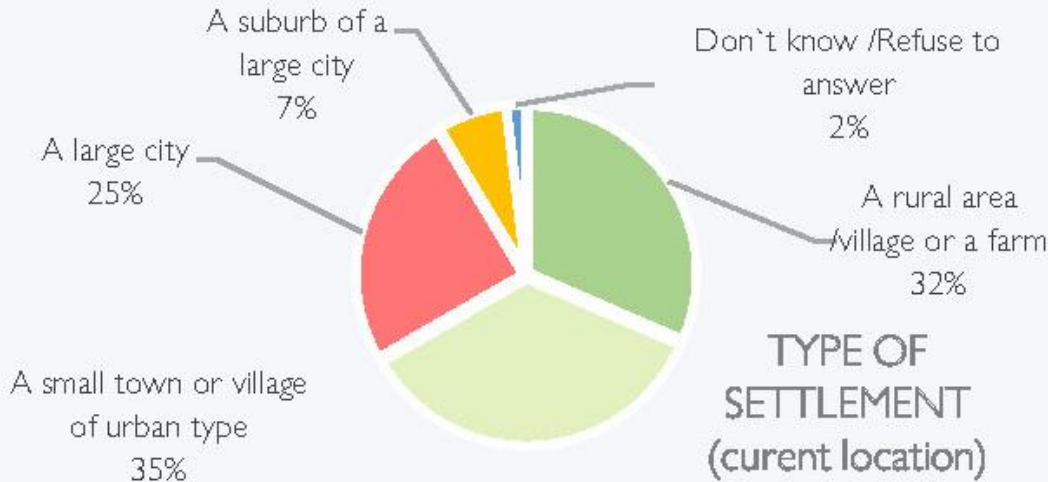
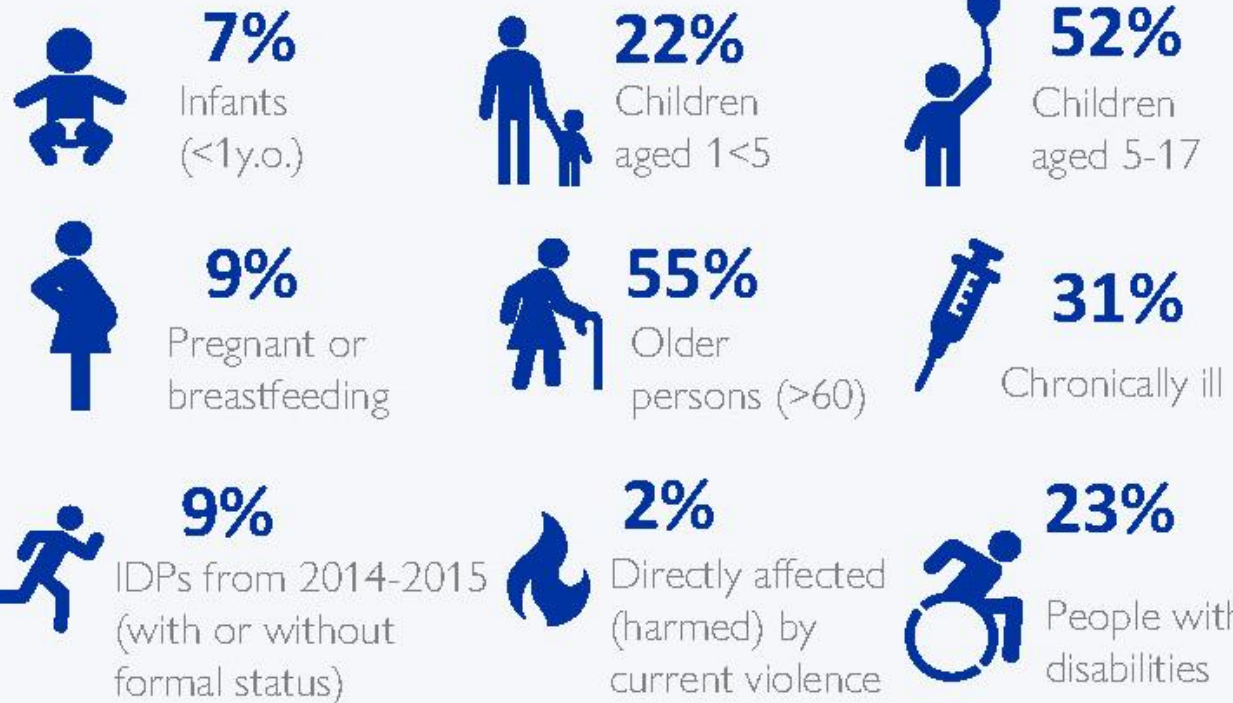
RESPONDENTS' AGE GROUP*

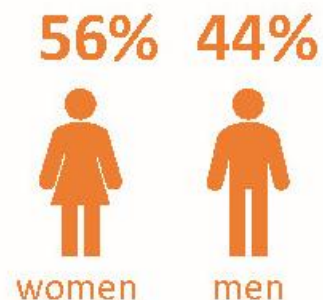
The distribution of IDPs across types of settlements remains stable over time.

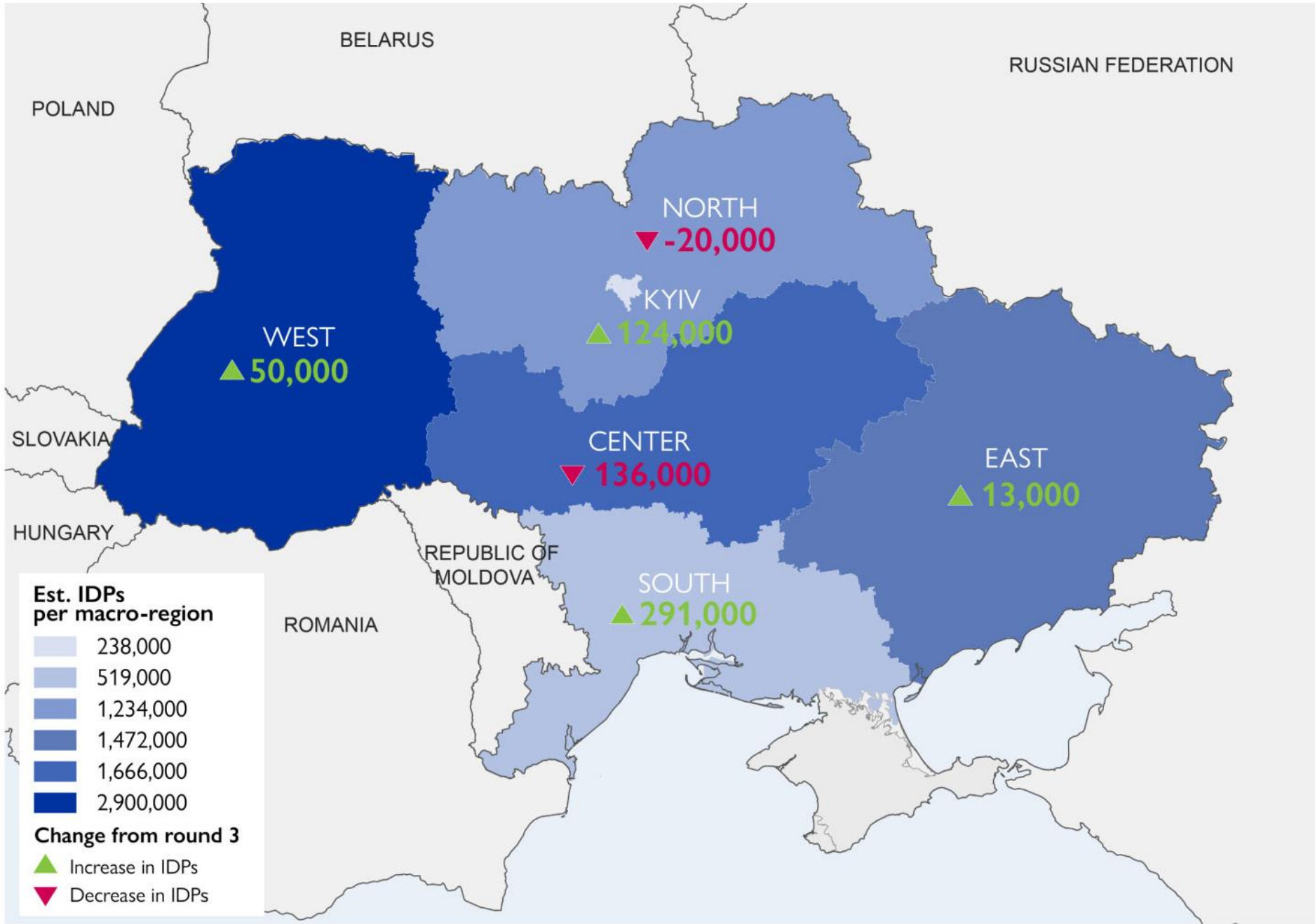

35% of the non-displaced reported having close family members/relatives who used to live with them in one household or city/village/area, who are now far away from them now because of the war. This share is highest among respondents from Kyiv (46%) and East (40%), and lowest among respondents in the Centre macro-region (25%). Reasons for family separation included the displacement of relatives, their enrollment in military service, or loss of communication channels.

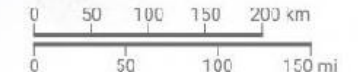

i Humanitarian access severity levels are estimated using a simplified version of the NRC Hard-to-Reach methodology. Considering the amount and type of information currently available, it represents only the access of relief actors (national and local authorities, national and International NGOs) to people affected, and does not take into account the access of the affected population to external assistance. Future version of the severity map will cover this important gap. The severity ratings are based on the authors' appreciation of the volatility of security conditions and the physical and administrative impediments being reported. The rating builds on data provided by the humanitarian and conflict-analysis communities, corroborated with key informant interviews. This map should be used with caution as the ratings are currently available at the Oblast level and might hide some important variations at the Raion level.

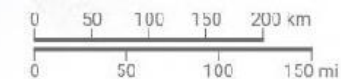

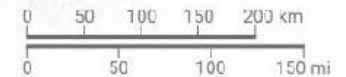
